Dear Or Hadash Community,

Beginning with the brutal attacks of October 7th and their global aftermath, this year has been one marked by uncertainty, trauma, and disturbing and damaging rhetoric. A global debate about the meaning, nature, and future of Zionism, both from outside the Jewish community and within it, has fueled a resurgence in antisemitism and a rise in internal distrust and disdain between groups of Jews. And also, it's a presidential election year... Yes, the 11 months have been a real doozie - and certainly not the year we were expecting as we gathered for last year's High Holiday services.

As we approach the 5785 High Holidays of *Rosh HaShanah* and *Yom Kippur*, we embrace its liturgy, songs and rituals as an opportunity for entering and centering ourselves - both as individuals and as a whole community. As we journey through the season together, may we find moments of transcending - rising above the din and churning of the media grind - ready to begin the New Year with renewed energy, resilience, and joy.



Childcare Information - Childcare SIGN UP on reverse side -

We are delighted to offer childcare again this year!

Parents will find it easier to support their children's participation in whatever youth-centric services and activities are appropriate for them, without having to bring siblings to programming that isn't geared to them. We also hope childcare will make it easier for parents to factor in their own spiritual needs... because the High Holidays are for grown-ups, too.

Parents may bring children to childcare and pick them up according to whatever schedule works for them, including dropping off and picking up their children multiple times over the course of the day.

For children 6 months to 8 years old, we are offering childcare:

Rosh HaShanah Day One 10am - 1pm Yom Kippur from 9:30am - 12:45pm Our High Holiday childcare provider is a professional educator with all clearances.



If your child is not toilet-trained, please leave a diaper bag in childcare.

Childcare is only guaranteed if you register by Monday September 23.

• If you do NOT register in advance, you are welcome to take your child upstairs to ask the childcare provider if they can comfortably take responsibility for your child. They will do so if possible, but we reserve the right to decline if the number of people who wish to drop-off their children proves unwieldy.

Childcare is being held in the classrooms on the second floor.

• We regret that the second floor is only accessible by stairs and we regret that there is no wheelchair/stroller accessible location in which we can hold childcare. Childcare will be based in classrooms 207 and 205, although our childcare provider may take the children in their care to the High Holiday children's activity stations in 203.


